	2A. If the existing road, which runs through the <b>Greater Glider</b> ( <i>Petauroides</i> <b>volans</b> ) habitat shown at Attachment A, needs to be widened for vehicle movement purposes or road maintenance, then the <b>approval holder</b> must identify and provide the <b>Department</b> with GPS coordinates of the trees that will be cleared. The trees must not be cleared unless the <b>Department</b> has approved the clearing in writing.
